MEET JUDY MORLEY - OUR NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR!

Serendipity - "the unsought, unintended, and/or unexpected discovery...that happens by accident and sagacity."

Serendipity truly sums up how Judy Morley found the Carroll County Arts Council. When dining at a nearby local restaurant with a friend, her attention was drawn to the Arts Center's marquee but the



building was closed. At home back in Denver, she looked up the CCAC's website and saw the posting for a new Executive Director. Having served on public planning commissions and architectural review boards, Morley said our mission statement resonated with her and she applied for the position. The Search Committee unanimously agreed that with her PhD in the History of the American West, extensive leadership and fundraising credentials, and her stellar communication skills, Judy was the ideal candidate for the new Executive Director.

Judy and her husband, Steve Burton, along with their 3 dogs, recently settled on a home in Gettysburg. "This is a big adventure for me, to move across the country and start a new life, says Judy. "We moved to be closer to my daughter, who is in Philadelphia, and my stepdaughter, who will be starting college on Staten Island this fall. I'm looking forward to getting involved in Westminster and to build relationships in the art community."

Judy will begin working alongside Sandy Oxx in early May to the end of June to ensure plenty of orientation and a smooth transition.



"Great Blue Heron" Sculpture **Unveiled at Piney Run Park**

Sykesville artist Virginia Sperry's welded steel sculpture "The Great Blue Heron" was unveiled at Piney Run Park on April 12. The magnificent bird perches just off shore in Piney Run Reservoir near the boathouse. After many weeks of research about the native species and working with the park's staff to design a set of pilings to which the sculpture would be attached; construction of the sculpture began in the spring of 2017.

Sperry welded rebar and steel rods together to make the armature and then covered the frame with hand-cut steel "feathers" which gives the piece a rich texture. The project was made possible by a grant from the Maryland State Arts Council with additional funds provided by the Carroll County Arts Council and Piney Run Park Recreation and Conservation Council.
